- A) Must a defender play a card just because declarer has seen its face?
- B) South leads a heart. East has the ♥7 as a minor penalty card but plays the ♥A to the trick. Is this permitted?
- C) East bids 1D over North's 1S. There are no grounds to consider inadvertency. May East correct her insufficient bid with a double?

- D) Are penalties applied for an established revoke from dummy?
- E) May a player correct a revoke after an opponent leads to the next trick?
- F) May an appeals committee change a ruling based on law when it believes the facts were correctly ascertained by you?
- G) May 4 cards at a time be dealt into each hand followed by 3 cards at a time into each until there are 13 cards in each hand?
- H) May declarer look at his last quitted trick to see whether the lead is from his hand or from dummy?
- I) Should a player call you if he accidentally learns something about a board he is yet to play?
- J) Is an agreement to open 1NT with 4441 shape hands and 15-18 HCP permitted under QBA Green System classification?
- K) May a player deliberately revoke a second time in order to conceal an earlier accidental revoke?
- L) A defender has led an ace to a trick. May dummy automatically pick up and play a small card of that suit?
- M) May the auction continue if an inadmissible double is followed by a call by the next player in rotation?
- N) Is dummy allowed to ask during play if a defender could have followed suit?
- O) A player writes a "2" then crosses it out and bids 1S. Is this permitted?
- P) May a player ask a question for no reason other than to make an opponent think that he doesn't hold a particular card?

(a) West calls in tempo. At this stage, North makes a late alert of 2C. On enquiry North explains that 2C is game force and doesn't promise a club suit. West holds ♠ QJ65 ♥ 83 ♦ KQ872 ♣ K6 and tells you away from the table that systemically a double of an artificial bid suggests a good holding in that suit. You rule that West may change his call without penalty. On what law have you based this ruling?

(b) West replaces his double with a pass. North now asks East what the double meant. What is your ruling?
