(a) 10 tables set up as a Skip Mitchell; 4 boards per round

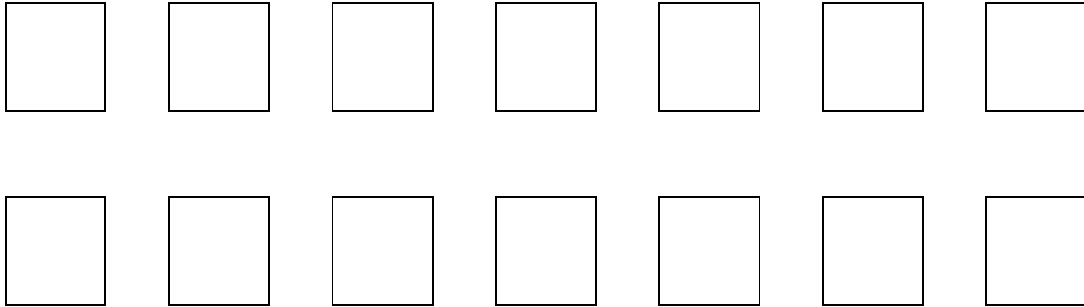
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(b) 14½ tables set up as a 3½ Appendix Mitchell; 3 boards per round

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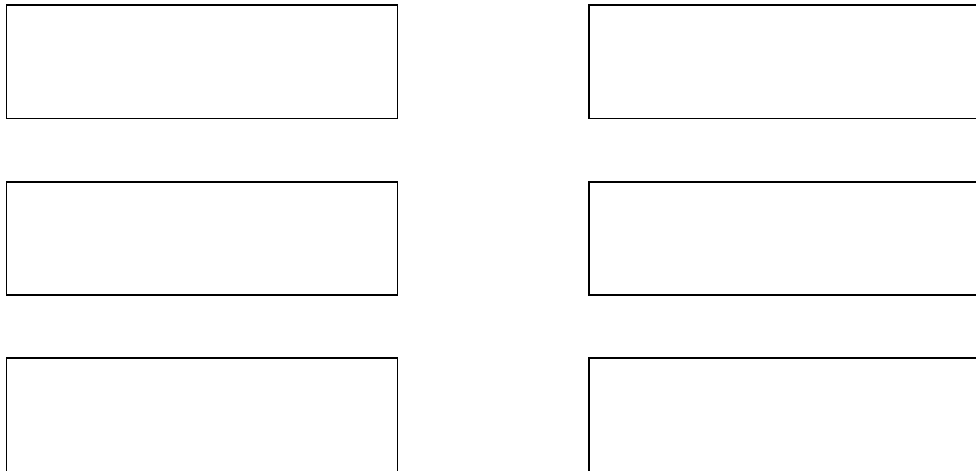
QUESTION FOUR

QUESTION FIVE

Going back through the play of the hand, and placing the missing card in East's hand, East won a trick by ruffing instead of following suit, which constitutes a revoke, and thus 2 tricks were transferred to NS.
