### **QUESTION ONE**

- A) Is rectification applied after an established revoke on Trick 12?
- B) May players make their own rulings if they are sure they know what to do?

- C) Are there circumstances in which an insufficient bid may be corrected by a double?
- D) A player accidentally drops his ♠5 face up on the table after the auction has started. Must his partner pass at his next turn?
- E) Is it possible for the one defender to have two minor penalty cards?
- F) May an unintended call be changed if the partner has already called following it?
- G) You have imposed a disciplinary penalty for repeated use of abusive language. May an appeals committee reduce the penalty?
- H) Apart from the times when declarer may touch cards in dummy, may players touch cards of another player unless instructed by you?
- I) An opening bid of 2D is being used to show 5-9 hcp with either 6 hearts or 6 spades. May this be part of a green system?
- J) While play is in progress, may players take it upon them selves to face quitted tricks to see if an established revoke has occurred?
- K) A presumed defender believes his partner has failed to alert as required. He calls you at the end of the auction about this. Is this the correct procedure?
- L) East has the ♥6 as a minor penalty card on the table. She wins Trick 7 and leads her ♣5 to Trick 8. Is this a legal option under the Laws?
- M) Must dealing be random unless the event is designed to replay past deals?
- N) South opens 1C when East is dealer. East does not notice the 1C and makes her opening bid of 2C. Does 2C stand as the opening bid?
- O) May an inadmissible double be accepted?
- P) Is Dummy the only person responsible for the correct display of the dummy?
- Q) Does declarer's sighting of a defender's card necessarily mean that the card must be played?

South notices immediately that his intended bid is insufficient, blurts out, “Oh, I didn’t see the 2D,” and changes 2C to a double. You are now called and West does not accept 2C. A 2C opening shows a big hand 21+ hcp. (2D) X is systemically for take-out showing an opening hand of some description. What is your ruling?

South is declarer in 3H. West leads the ♣2 and North displays the dummy as shown.

♣2 - ♣6 - ♣Q - ♥4

South's ♣4 is hidden behind another card so South ruffs the ♣Q and leads the ♥5.

The ♣4 is discarded later on a diamond and you are called at this time.

What do you do at this time?

South makes 10 tricks. What is your ruling?

East as the dealer bids 1S. He calls you and says that he has made an unintended call. Away from the table East says that he was talking to someone walking past and although he had looked at his hand he hadn't actually decided what to call. What is your ruling?

South leads the ♦9 to Trick 3. West accidentally pulls out both the ♦10 and the ♦7 and places both on the table and both are visible. What is your ruling?

**QUESTION SEVEN**

West realises after Trick 10 that he has only two cards left. You find the ♠J stuck under the ♠5 that West played to Trick 7. North won Trick 7 with the ♠10 What do you do?

West is declarer in 4H and after winning Trick 4 leads the ♦Q from his own hand towards the singleton ♦3 in dummy. South immediately plays his singleton ♦K before North has played to the trick. What is your ruling?

North calls you claiming that if declarer ruffs the diamond and leads his ♣3 then he, North, will win a club and a heart.

How many of the last four tricks do you award to EW?
