### **QUESTION ONE**

You are conducting a night session for your club. Players expect to play between 27 and 30 boards. What movement would you use for the following number of tables **and** how many boards will be played? (Give separate numbers for NS and EW should they be different.) Provide **one only** movement for each number of tables.

(a) 11 tables

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(b) 11½ tables

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(c) 8 tables

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(d) 6 tables

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(e) 5½ tables

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**QUESTION TWO**

You consider using a NS Rover Mitchell or a Skip Mitchell movement for 7½ tables playing 4 boards per round. Discuss the merits of each.

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**QUESTION THREE**

(a) You have 10 tables ready to play in a special promotional event that is based on playing Boards 1-28 and no others. There must be a NS and an EW field, Howell movements are not permitted. What movement would you use?

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(b) 40 boards have been distributed for a 10 table Skip Mitchell when another pair walks in. Suggest **two** options for a new movement that will cause minimal disruption and detail changes to be made.

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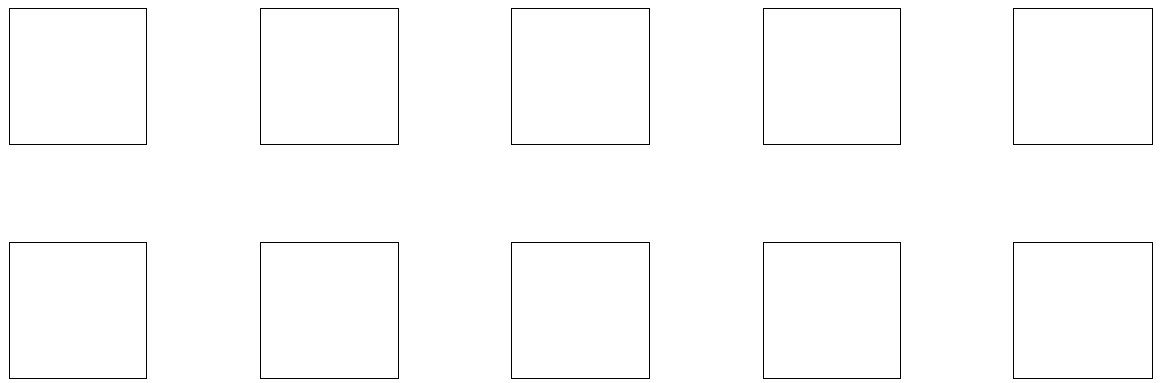
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**QUESTION FOUR**

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(b) Show the position of teams and board numbers for the first round of your event. Draw arrows to show how each will be moved at the end of the first round.

Only 9 tables turned up for the second session. You interchanged some pairs and ran a 9 table Mitchell with 3 board rounds (27 boards played).

Pair A earned 296 matchpoints in session one and 276 matchpoints in session two.

Pair B earned 276 matchpoints in session one and 296 matchpoints in session two.
