QUESTION ONE

You are conducting an evening duplicate pairs session. Players expect to play between 27 and 30 boards. (Those sitting out may play fewer.) What movement would you use for the following tables **and** how many boards will be played by NS pairs and EW pairs? Provide **one only** movement for each number of tables.

(a) 11 tables

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(b) 10½ tables

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(c) 3½ tables

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(d) 15 tables

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(e) 9½ tables

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QUESTION TWO

(a) Why might you choose to use a Howell movement rather than a Mitchell movement for your duplicate pairs session?

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(b) You are running a two session pairs event to find a single winning pair. 16 pairs have entered. They are A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, P and are listed in order from the best pair down to the least experienced pair. To be clear, A is the top seed and P is the lowest seed. A Share and Relay Mitchell movement is to be used for both sessions.

How might you seat these pairs for the first session?

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(b) 8 tables are set up ready to play a Share and Relay Mitchell with 4 boards per round. Boards have been distributed but play has not started when another pair arrives. Suggest changes to the movement that will cause minimal disruption.

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(c) Most tables have completed their first board in a 5 table Howell movement. 27 boards in play. (No half table.) A pair visiting from overseas arrives having become lost on the way. How do you accommodate this pair?

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QUESTION FOUR

(a) List the table order for a NS Rover Pair added to a 12 Table Share and Relay Mitchell movement. (12½ tables will be in the movement.)

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(b) List the table order for a NS Rover Pair added to an 11 table Mitchell. (11½ tables are in the movement.)

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QUESTION FIVE

Enter the pair numbers and boards for the first round of a 6 table ¾ Howell. Nine rounds of 3 boards are to be played. Show how pairs will move after the first round and draw arrows to indicate how boards will be moved.

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QUESTION EIGHT

Section A: 9½ tables - 1½ Appendix Mitchell movement using 3 board rounds.

Section B: 8 tables - Skip Mitchell movement using 3 board rounds.

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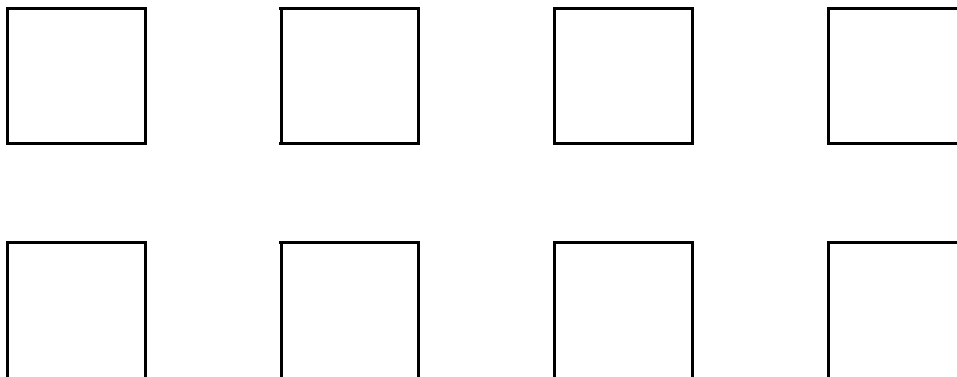
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QUESTION NINE
