Plan a two day pairs congress for 35 tables.

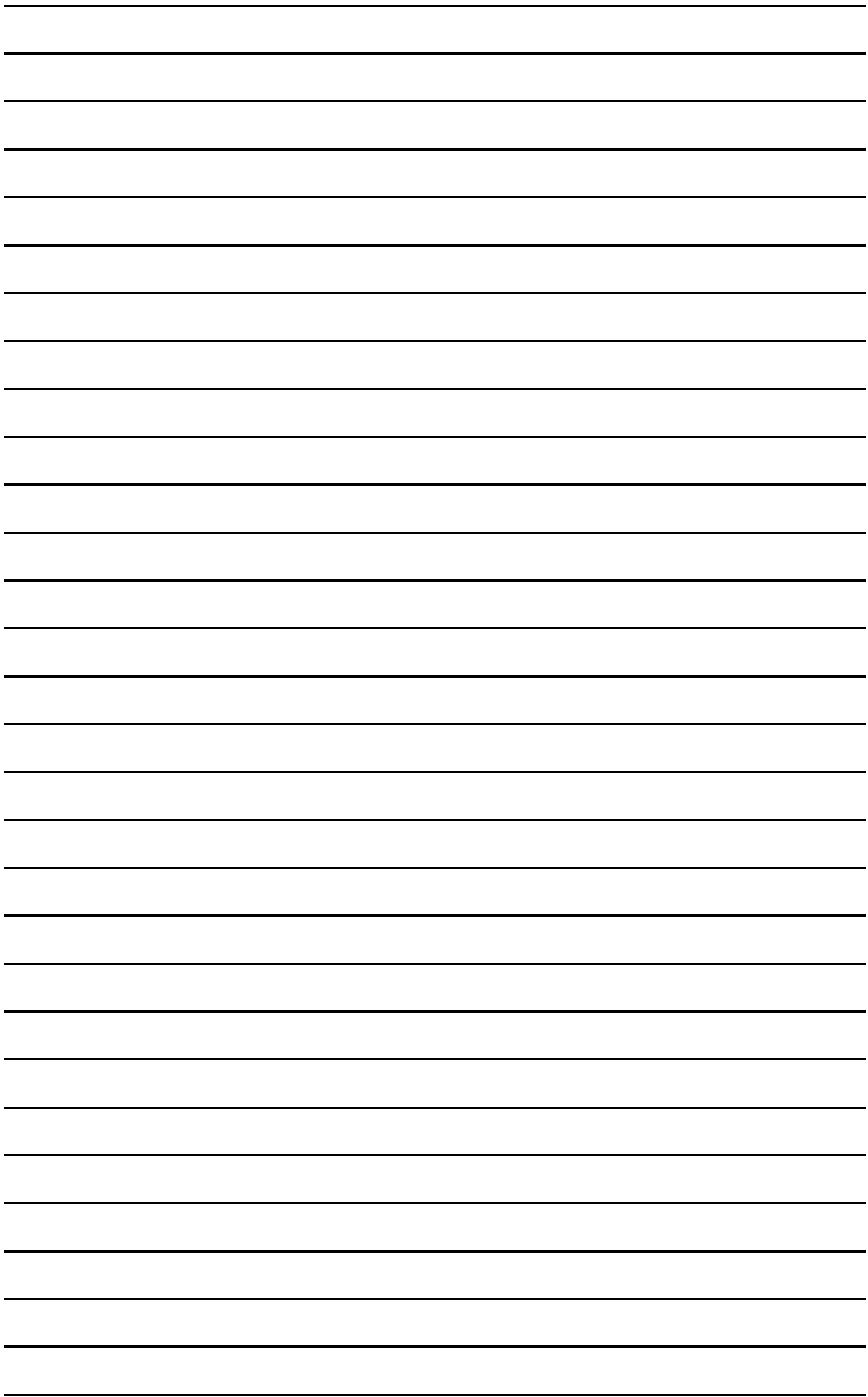
2 qualifying sessions and 2 sessions of barometer finals have been advertised.

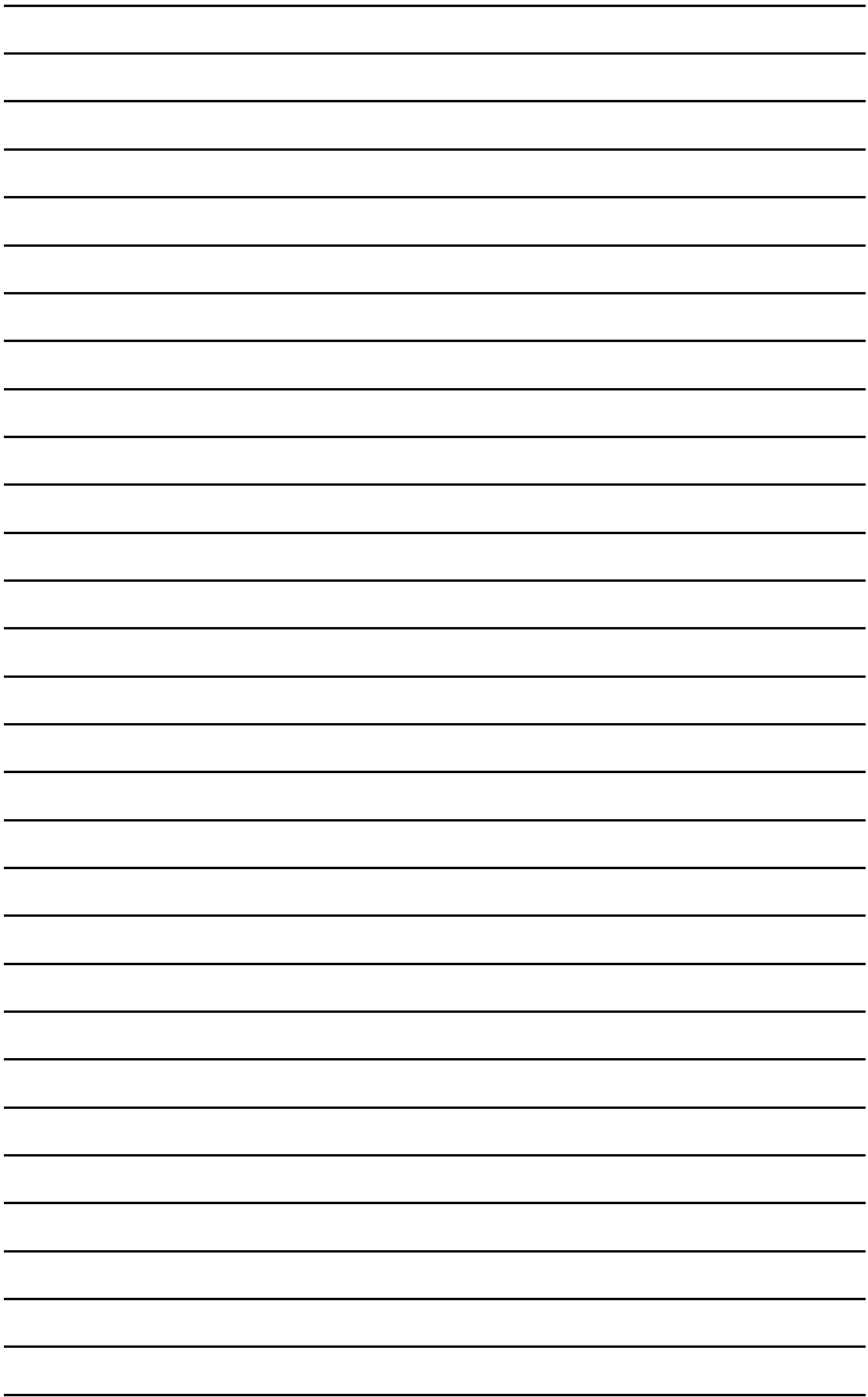
Players expect to play about 50 - 56 boards per day. 2 board rounds are very unpopular.
